The first chapter is an excellent, concise overview of how to initiate a research project in education and how to organize the research report; also very helpful for the proposal write-up. The following chapters are examples of research project reports, and are excellent models to follow (except that they are not academic reports, so the literature reviews are too short). They provide good examples of how to analyze data and write up methodology and results sections with both qualitative and quantitative research methods.

Short, introductory text. Good information on ethnographic methodologies interviewing and conducting classroom observations.

Short text and overview of theory and practice of case study research. Examples of forms and checklists. Good concrete examples of educational research.

#### In-depth Interviews

*Qualitative Interviewing: The Art of Hearing Data* Herbert J. Rubin & Irene S. Rubin MWC: H62 .R737 1995

A superb discussion of aspects of interviewing and how to do it for research. Discussions of how to frame questions and to maintain credibility (Ch. 4 & 7) and how to analyze and report data (Ch. 10 & 11) are very thorough with numerous examples. The book is not specifically about educational research, but the information is readily transferrable to educational issues.

#### Survey Questionnaires

*Improving Survey Questions: Design and Evaluation* Floyd J. Fowler, Jr. MWC: HN29 .F67 1995

Detailed discussion of decisions in writing survey questions and formatting questionnaires. Good coverage of how to ask attitude and opinion questions. Focuses on public interest surveys rather than education specifically, but the concepts are transferable.

Good information on research questions and techniques (Ch. 2). Excellent information on attitude surveys (Ch. 7). British author.

#### Survey Research Handbook, 2nd Ed.

Excellent chapters with examples on writing questions, writing answer scales, organizing the questions and testing the questionnaire (Ch. 4-6). Good information on how to use tables and graphs, with examples (Ch. 12), but not exactly APA style.

An excellent, brief guide for designing questionnaires, especially Ch. 1. Numerous examples of different question types; good overview of using tables and charts; advice on giving presentations. Solid advice, succinctly presented, but little explanation.
