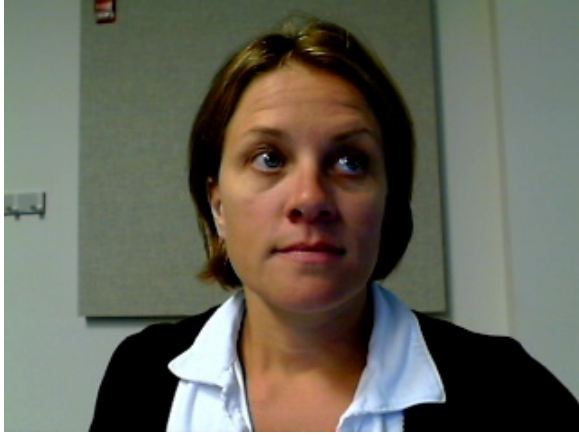
She locked them in the tower, putting a curse on them, in hopes that technology terrorism would overcome them. However, she

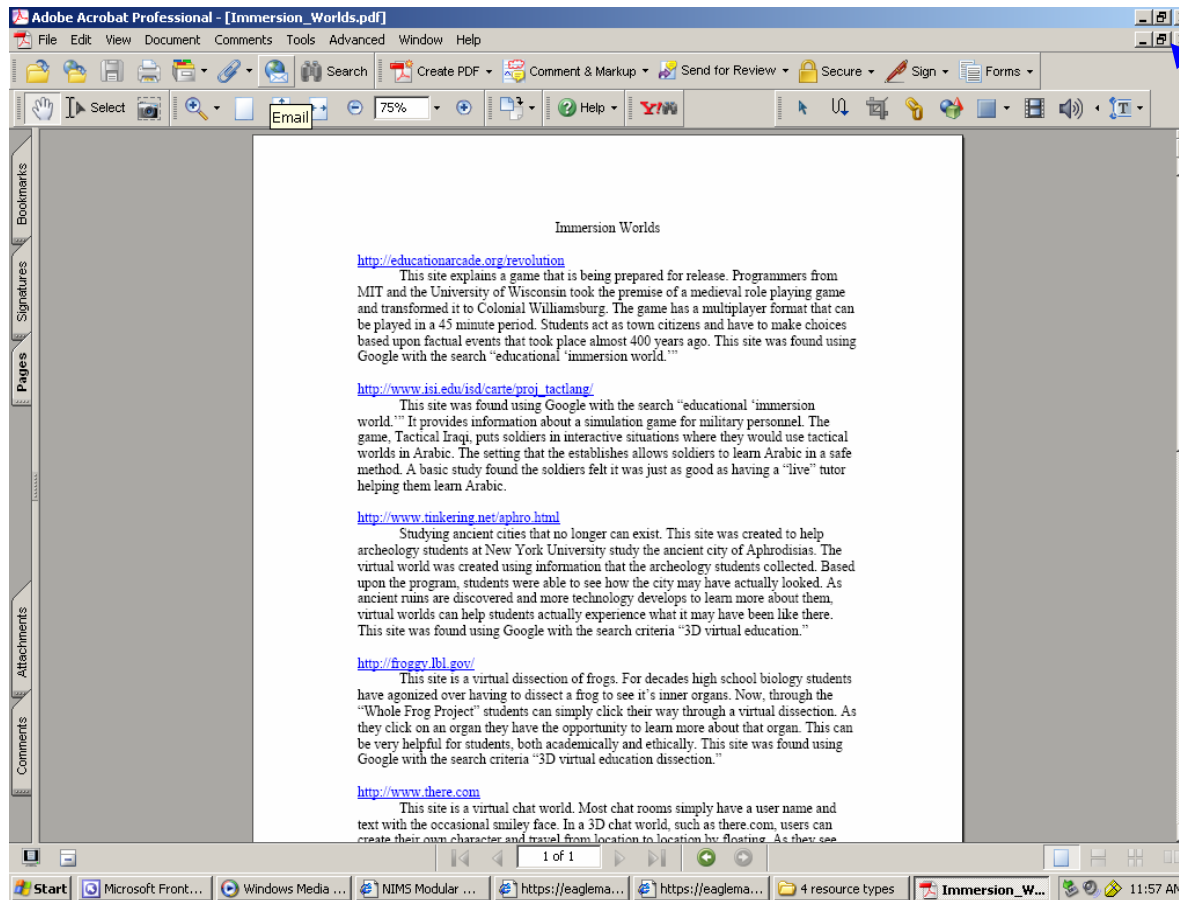


This was my personal favorite! Just where I want them. It is much easier to keep track of the boys when they are in the stocks!



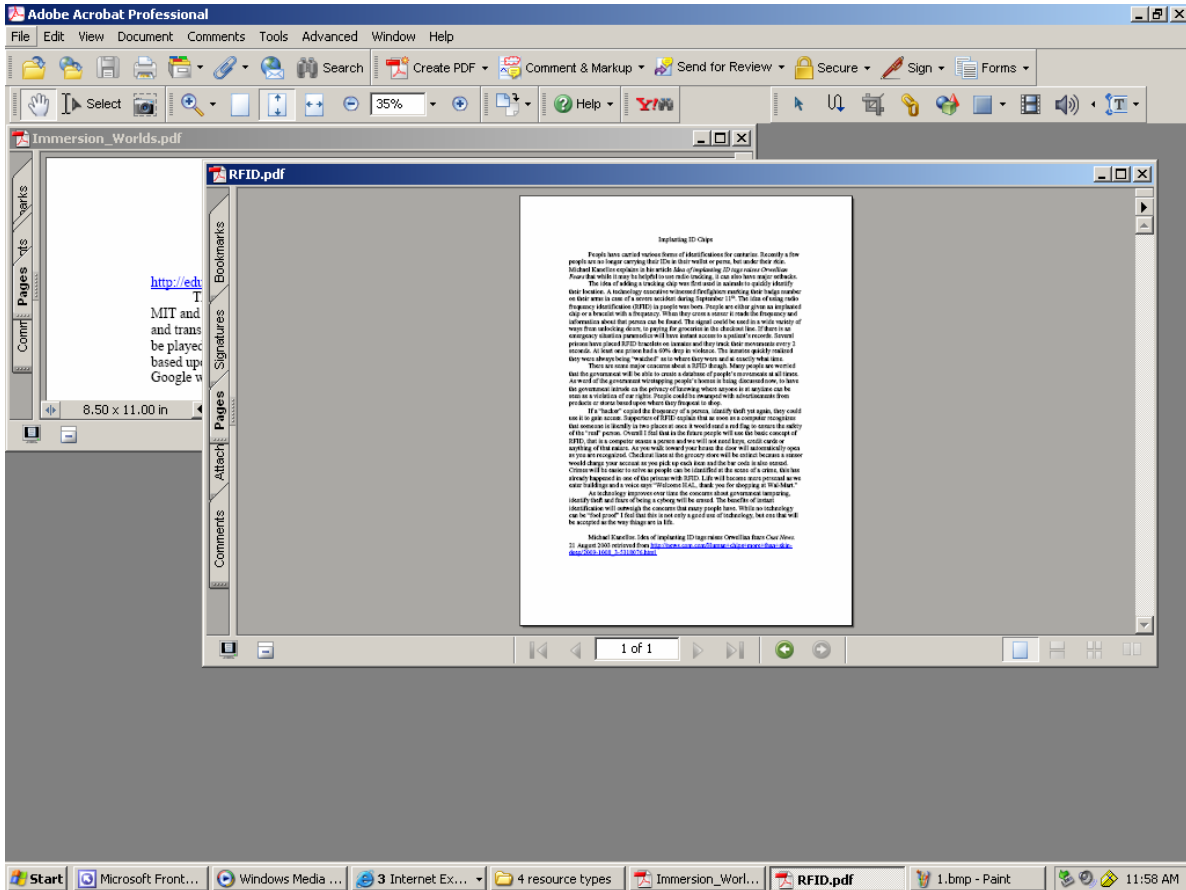

Combine PDF Documents in Acrobat Professional 7

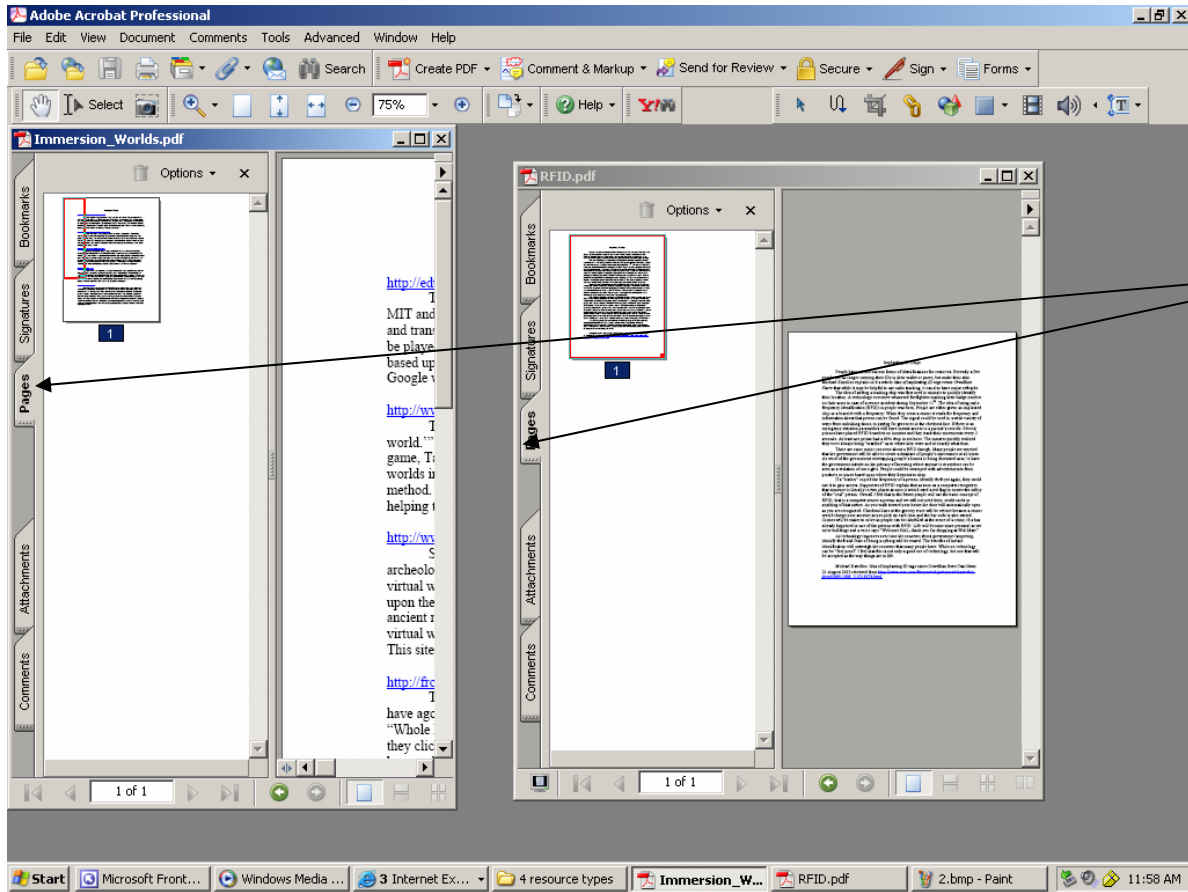


Start by opening your first PDF file.

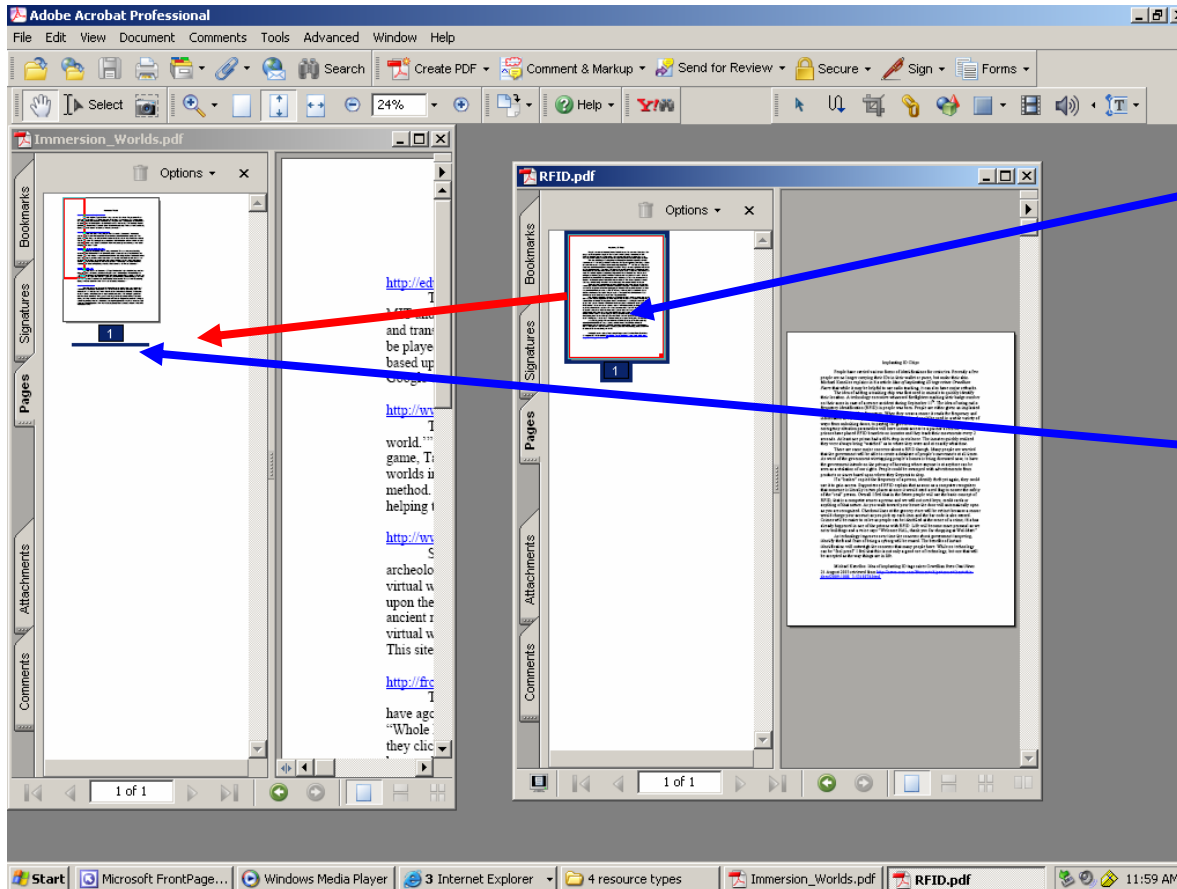
Click on the double box to reduce its size.



Go to File and Open
Open another PDF file
You should see a screen like this.



Click on the tab marked "Page" for both files.



Click on the page from the new file and drag it over (think solitaire) to where ever you want the page to be in your main document.

A blue bar will show where the page will go.

If there are several pages, hold down the "ctrl" button on the keyboard and click on each page. Then drag the first page of the file to the document you are making. All of the pages should follow in order.
